




SOS-MOBILITIES – BULLETIN no 3

This is the third bulletin of the Leonardo da Vinci SOS-Mobilities project (2013-1-FI1-LEO05-12543) that is funded in the EU Lifelong Learning Program. Since the second meeting in Berlin the project partners have been busy working with the motivational guidance booklet, frameworks and checklists.



The third project meeting; Teach the teachers training was held in Rouen, France from the 14^{th} – 16^{th} of October. The focus was on testing materials that will support and help teachers to get involved in the important job of making international mobilities available to all students and not just for those with the best results in the theoretical subjects. We had invited a few teachers from each project partner to take part in the Teach the Teachers Training. Also Eva Tervala from Keuda, an external evaluator, took part in the meeting.



The aims of the meeting were to introduce the teachers to our project, explain what international mobilities are and why we think it's important to include low-motivated students. We also explained what the teacher's role is. We introduced different tools that they can use, for example Motivation & teambuilding (Germany) and also Coaching (UK)

We, who work in this project, are of the opinion that the most important thing that international mobilities can offer students taking part in international mobilities is the growth of the hidden competences such as tolerance, values, cultural knowledge in order to be able to work and





function with divers groups of people regardless of their background or location. We believe that including students that fit our target group of low motivated students with poor self-esteem, in international mobilities will have a life-changing impact on the students. They need more support and help than the self-sufficient students. Therefore teachers in VET are the most important and the most valuable tool when it comes to making it possible to include these special needs students in international mobilities. The materials we develop will strongly support their important work.
